#### **DRIFTER NEWS**

NOAA's Global Drifter Program (GDP), an affiliate program of the ADP, reached a significant milestone: 30,000 drifter deployments since the start of the program in 1979! The drifter was one of ten deployed during the recent RAMA Tropical Moored Buoy cruise in the Indian Ocean along 67°E. The RAMA cruise was conducted aboard the Research Vessel Isabu, in close collaboration between the Korean Institute of Ocean Science & Technology (KIOST) and NOAA. This partnership between NOAA and KIOST is an example of how the GDP collaborates with numerous national and international partners to achieve its mission of maintaining a <u>global 5° x 5° array</u>.
